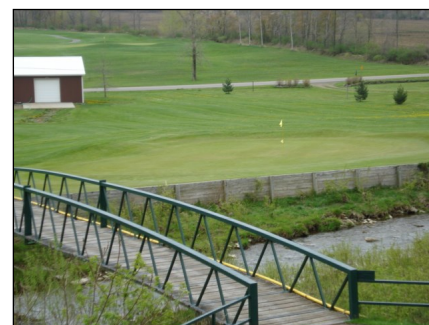

River Valley History

The Beginning

On July 2, 1963, a group of influential citizens of the Cowanesque Valley area held a meeting in the Westfield Crary Fire Department Building to discuss building a golf course. One of these citizens being none other than *Weldon Bailey*, who was a lifelong member at River Valley until his passing a couple of years ago. Traveling to Wellsville, Coudersport, Wellsboro and even farther for recreation could thus be eliminated. Kenneth Hegmann's 225 acre farm, just south of Phillips Station in the Jemison Valley, seemed an ideal spot since the farm was located halfway between Westfield and Knoxville. It offered scenic beauty and even a romantic history. Mary Jemison had once hunted the area with her Indian husband --- hence it was called "The Jemison".

Federal Housing Administration (FHA)

FHA (of the U.S. Department of Agriculture) agreed to loan half of the \$300,000 cost of the project if a substantial amount could be raised locally. This was done by selling Membership Certificates for \$100. They sold over 300 certificates allowing the loan to be granted. You can buy a certificate today for \$100 which allows you to vote at the annual meeting for who serves on the board of directors. See later page for more details about the Board.



Cowanesque Valley Recreation Association (CVRA)

On October 14, 1963, the CVRA was formed with the help of Weldon Bailey. Architect Raymond Hall, of Port Allegany, would design the clubhouse which also included a swimming pool. The building contract was awarded to Dominic Sama and Paul Ford and Son Lumber Company of Westfield. Local industries generously provided men and machinery for much of the work, and the holding of "bees" plus volunteer labor helped to reduce the cost.



Course Architect



Geoffrey Cornish (Aug 6, 1914—Feb 10, 2012) designed the attractive nine-hole golf course, utilizing existing hills as well as level areas to create a challenging course, and one that would also stimulate the use of an ever increasing number of carts. Hole #1 was our current #10. Very difficult starting hole as we do appreciate today with league play!

The very first greenskeeper, Joe Sweazy, was hired and housed in the former Hegmann home (the brick house near #15 tee).

Choosing a Name for the Club

In order to choose a name for the new recreation center a contest was held, and Lena Hopkins, of Westfield, won with the title, River Valley Country Club. The club opened for golf on July 3, 1965, and was formally dedicated on Saturday, April 30, 1966.

Expansion to 18 Holes

Geoffrey Cornish originally designed an 18 hole golf course but we could only afford to build a nine hole course back in the 60's.

On July 7, 1992, Kevin Howe, manager at the time, presented the Board of Directors with a plan to expand the golf course to 18 holes. Mike Schwarz made the motion to proceed pending approval of a \$120,000 loan. The course was opened for 18 holes of play in the summer of 1994.

Without the help of many key people, including John Bush, Jack Murdock, Clyde Bailey, Weldon Bailey, Larue and Audrey James, we would not have a golf course in our area today. Some of the original members are still active at River Valley.

Many thanks to all of the various board members, committee members, employees and volunteers who have helped River Valley sustain itself during many challenging years. As was the case back in the early days, finances are an ongoing battle which will be discussed more on the next page. Lets all work together to enjoy many more years to come.



FINANCIAL STATE

The club has lost a total of **\$45,000** over the past two seasons. In 2018, the weather was largely the issue causing the course to be closed for over 30 days resulting in a loss of ~\$32K. We saw better weather in 2019, but still lost roughly **\$13K**. Let me explain some details regarding this loss.

Our Mission

We live and always have right on the edge of black and red with our finances. We have always done this to keep the expense to our members as the lowest possible. If we lose members, which is inevitable with fewer people playing golf today, aging membership, health issues, etc., then we lose income generated from Dues, Tournaments, Leagues and general sales at the bar and pro shop.

The way we have always worked, and please check the year end financial report, we count on dues, tournament income, leagues and green fees. Most courses weigh heavier on dues to make sure they are better founded in that percentage of the income.

The **Mission** of the River Valley Club is to provide a golf and social facility for the enjoyment of its members and guests. We try to accomplish this with a very affordable membership and green fee rates for our guests. Below is a table showing Membership Dues (*discount rates*) at area courses. How do we compare?

Younger people are joining to help support all of us hopefully for a long time to come. They have helped lower the average age to **56** which is a trend we wish to see more of.

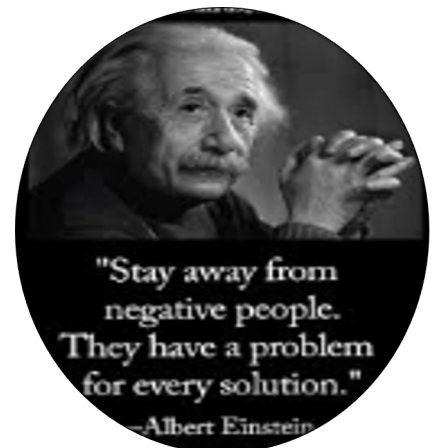
We have had an increase in the number of winter club rentals and are looking to be open more next winter for income to help keep your dues down. We will also strive to cut cost where possible.

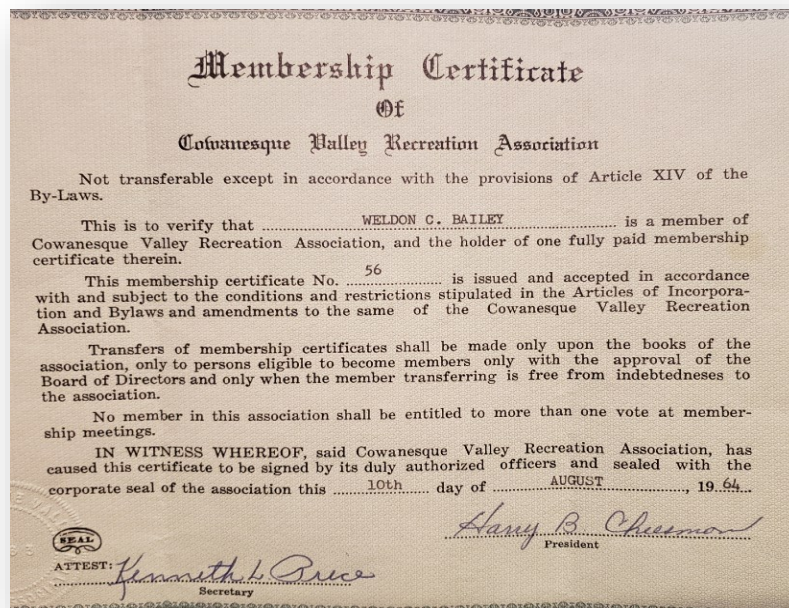

CVRA was incorporated in 1963 and does business as River Valley Country Club. Membership in this corporation shall be obtained by application to the board of directors (BOD) and upon approval, a membership certificate shall be issued upon payment of \$100.

You will have all privileges of membership including the right to vote subject to payment of your Annual Golf Membership Dues.



Board Of Directors

The business of CVRA is managed by a board of nine directors. All directors are elected for a (3) year term and may serve no more than (2) consecutive (3) year terms. In the event that no qualified candidates exist to fill the Board of Director vacancies, the Association Members will have the responsibility to re-elect Board members who have served (2) consecutive terms.

Annual Meeting

The annual meeting is currently held the 3rd Sunday in November. A review of the season including a Financial report is provided. An election for (3) directors will also be done.

Regular Meetings

2. The drainage issue by #1 tee is also being addressed. Some new pipe needs installed to allow the water to drain properly from the corner of hole #7 eventually down to hole #18 and #12 pond. This wouldn't be possible without Chuck Barber's volunteer help and equipment which would be very expensive to rent. Chuck has been very helpful to the club over the past few seasons so please thank Chuck when you see him. We plan to finish work on the new tee boxes started last year so they can be properly maintained this season.
3. Some equipment repairs are also needed. So the rush begins but we are looking forward to another great golf season. Hope to see everyone out there.

FRIDAY FUN LEAGUE

The couple's league on Friday will be replaced with a new "Friday Fun Night" concept with hopes to get more people at the course every Friday night. It is open to everyone and you simply sign up each week you want to play. Play will begin with a shotgun start every Friday at 5:00. The Pro Shop will determine the format and teams for each night. Details will be posted on the league bulletin board including cost, prizes, etc.

LEAGUE HANDICAP

- Each league player will have (1) handicap that is used for **all** leagues you participate in.
- Handicap** = Average of Last 5 Scores — 36 (36 being par)
 - ⇒ Example: Suppose your last (5) scores are: 40, 44, 41, 39, 42
 - ⇒ Average = 41.2
 - ⇒ Handicap = $41.2 - 36 = 5.2$ HDCP = 5 (round to nearest whole number)
 - ⇒ **NOTE**: This is a "league handicap" only. USGA sanctioned handicaps are calculated in a different manner. We can provide access to the GHIN handicap service if you wish to obtain an official USGA handicap. See the next page for more about official handicaps.

TEE IT FORWARD

- We have been implementing the Tee It Forward concept in our leagues the past couple years.
- TEE IT FORWARD encourages all golfers to play the course at a length that is aligned with their **average driving distance**. Age should **not** be used to choose the tee box.
- It is ultimately up to the player to fairly choose their tee based on integrity.
- Choose a tee where you **enjoy** the game and are **challenged** fairly.
- We believe the leagues can still be competitive, fair and enjoyable if everyone complies.



World Handicap System (WHS)

For those of you who maintain your own personal, USGA sanctioned Handicap using the GHIN system, will need to learn about the new World Handicap System rolling out this season.

WHO	This decision comes straight from the USGA and R&A – it is the new standard and we must adopt.
WHAT	Combines (8) different systems into (1) universal world-wide handicap system.
WHEN	The WHS and new GHIN platform rolled out on January 6th
WHERE	All across the world!
WHY	The USGA, R&A and other handicap associations wanted to make all course ratings, handicapping, and calculations universal. While the handicap system is not perfect (and never has been), it is the conduit that allows golfers of all skill levels to play a fair match – it is also one of the main reasons golf is unlike many other sports. Even a high-handicapper can play a professional using handicaps to make an even match.
HOW	In order to calculate your COURSE HANDICAP, players may go to: www.usga.org/content/usga/home-page/course-handicap-calculator.html You will need to know your HANDICAP INDEX, the COURSE RATING, SLOPE RATING, and PAR (these metrics will calculate your course handicap).

“OLD” SYSTEM VS “NEW” WHS SYSTEM

OLD SYSTEM	WHS
Avg of the 10 best out of 20 scores	Avg of the 8 best out of 20 scores
Hdcp Index was updated on the 1st and 15th of each month	Hdcp Index will be updated daily (provided you submitted a score the day before)
ESC —the max score on each hole was based on your handicap	Max score will be “Net Double Bogey” max = par + 2 + strokes you have on hole
Weather plays no role in scores.	Weather conditions may be used to adjust score (provided at least 8 eligible players submit scores)

POSTING SCORES ON GHIN

All players are expected to act with **integrity** by following the Rules of Handicapping. Each score you post must be played in the company of at least one other person/marker, be played by the *Rules of Golf*, and be properly adjusted to record a max net double bogey each hole. Also, you should post scores before midnight on day played to maintain integrity of your handicap and realize weather conditions for the day you play may also be factored in.

Note: The GHIN system allows you to post scores hole by hole which will help you adjust your scores to “net double bogey”. If you purchased a GHIN handicap and need help with the new system, please stop by the Pro Shop to discuss things or send me an email.

I will also post additional HDCP info on our bulletin boards and web site for your review.



MEN'S ASSOCIATION

Looking for something new to try?

Do you like to play your own ball in events?

Were you a fan of the Dew Sweepers? This may be for you!

WHAT IS IT?

- A group of guys that would enjoy some friendly competition followed by a drink or two on the patio as we share a few laughs and bask in the glory or the defeat of the day's round!
- There will be **(5)** events. (1) per month.
- Each event will be held on a **Sunday** morning (*start time 9:00 am*).
- Pairings will be made by Pro Shop but you can request playing partners.
- You **DON'T have** to play ALL events to join.
- The schedule is tentatively set for the following dates :
 1. May 17th
 2. June 14th
 3. July 25th
 4. August 23rd
 5. September 13th

WHAT IS THE ENTRY FEE?

- **\$40 total** (\$25 to prize pot) (\$15 to meal at end of season)
- **Optional Skins Game:** \$5 extra at each event (*gross and net like league play*)

WHAT IS THE FORMAT/SCORING SYSTEM?

- Each event is Individual based with handicap.
- A different Point system such as Callaway, Stableford, Quota, Peoria will be used each event
⇒ Details about system will be posted before event
- Each event you play, you will earn points as follows:
 - ⇒ 1st = 10 pts
 - ⇒ 2nd = 7 pts
 - ⇒ 3rd = 5 pts
 - ⇒ 4th = 4 pts
 - ⇒ 5th = 3 pts
 - ⇒ 6th = 2 pts
 - ⇒ All other participants get 1 point for playing.

Prizes/Meal

- On the day of the last event, a meal will be provided after conclusion of round.
- Prize winners for the season will be awarded based on Total Points Earned.

NOTE:

Players who play in the Men's Association will be given first preference for playing in the Battle of the Border with Indian Hills this year.



HOLE IN ONE CLUB

The Rules

- The annual fee to join the club is \$10.00. If you wish to join, see the pro shop.
- A hole in one can be recorded only during the club season which runs from May 1 through October 31 of each year.
- You must be with at least **two** other witnesses.
- **The golf round must be a recordable score.** You may not be hole jumping around the course playing holes multiple times during the round.
- You must play from your “regular tee” or back farther than you normally play. If you are a white tee player, you can’t play from the red tees to claim prize even in a tournament. However if you are a white tee player, you can win if teeing off from the blue tees.
- Mulligans cannot be used to win hole in one prize money.
- Hole #12 - see below for unique payout rules.



Prize Fund

- Money received each year will be dispersed at an equal percentage to each of the three shorter par three holes (3, 5, and 16).
- Until further notice, the Board feels it fair to the members to **freeze** the money going into hole #12's pot and to divide the yearly amount evenly among the other three par 3 holes. In this way, the successful members will receive a bit more with each hole in one on the other par 3 holes.

Hole in One Winner(s)

- At the end of each season, hole winners will receive amounts equal to an even division of the money in that same hole. If there are no winners on a given hole, the pot of money for that hole, carries forward to the next season.
- There will be a \$500 reward for a hole in one on any par 4 hole.

Hole #12

- Hole #12 has a unique payout until further notice. A limit of \$2,000 will be awarded to any single winner making a hole in one from the **upper tees**. If two golfers get a hole in one, each will receive \$1K. If three golfers, or more, are successful in a given season, they will split the entire pot evenly. \$2K seems to be a fair reward on #12.
- Lower Tee boxes will receive an equal payout to the other par 3's current year's allocation amount. Example: \$1500 is paid to the hole in one club for a given year. \$500 will be allocated to holes 3,5,16. If a lower tee box player gets a hole in one, they would also receive \$500. Of course, multiple winners on the same hole split the pot on that hole evenly.
